FMC Commissioner Cordero Heads to Long Beach

Federal Maritime Commissioner Mario Cordero will be leaving his position at the FMC next month to serve as the new Executive Director of the Port of Long Beach, California.

“It has been a privilege to serve on the Federal Maritime Commission these past six years,” said Cordero, “and it was a distinct honor that during my tenure I was entrusted with the Chairmanship of the agency.”

Commissioner Cordero was also the 2016 recipient of the Bi-State’s Malcom McLean Award. “We felt it was important to recognize Chairman Mario Cordero for the forward-thinking initiatives he put forth during his tenure at the Federal Maritime Commission,” said Bi-State President Jeff Bader. “His strong leadership resulted in a high level of communication amongst all stakeholders, directing us towards a climate of greater understanding and cooperation.”

News & Updates from the PANYNJ

The following news & information was provided by Bethann Rooney, Assistant Director of the PANYNJ Port Department:

- The Bayonne Bridge moved to All Electronic Tolling (AET) at the end of February. In the event you do not have an EZPass, you will get a bill in the mail based on a license plate read. Failure to pay the bill on time will result in an additional fee. Those truckers and drivers that were reluctant to get EZ-Pass in the past, may be motivated now by the inconvenience of needing to mail in each Toll payment, and the risk of having to pay an even higher toll.



- There is still a relatively large number of companies serving GCT New York that are not participating in the Toll Reimbursement Program. For those trucks that have EZ Pass and enroll in the reimbursement program, the toll is rolled back to the 2008 rate. There is no cost to participate. When you cross one of the PA's bridges in Staten Island and complete a transaction at GCT within a specified time, a rebate is sent directly to your bank account within a matter of days. - As most of our community is already aware, the NJDOT has commenced a project to replace three I-78 ramps that go over Routes 1&9 and connect to Port Street. The project is expected to continue through the end of 2018, and will require overnight and weekend closures. There will be changes in traffic patterns through the area; drivers are encouraged to use care and follow all signage.

Important Tire Safety Tips

While the warmer weather of Spring and Summer are a welcome change for many, rising temperatures bring an increased risk of Tire Overheating. According to Bi-State Member Silvia Liberti of Ride Tire Truck Center, "Now is the time to start assessing the condition of your tires, and take action to repair or replace worn tires, *before* problems occur." Liberti says truckers should look for treadwear and tread damage caused by winter potholes, cracking, bulging, cuts or other signs of weakened tires. Proper inflation is also essential. 
Construction Updates/Gate Changes at APM Terminals

Earlier this month, APM Terminals announced a change in the location of their bobtail exit. As of April 24th, all bobtails must use the new exit lanes on Tripoli Street, near the empty annex. Beginning Wednesday, April 26th, APM Terminals announced some additional changes on terminal that will temporarily affect their empty gate lanes.

The entrance to the empty annex on Tripoli Street will remain the same, however there will be a change to how the OTR truckers are routed to the empty gate kiosks once they gate in. Six (6) of the eight (8) empty gate kiosks will be available over the next two weeks while construction commences. They are expecting to be back to the full capacity of eight (8) empty gate kiosks no later than Monday, May 8th.

APMT expects no disruption to service during this temporary change.



GCT-Bayonne Expands Appointment Window



On Thursday, April 20th, Global Container Terminal-Bayonne expanded the Appointment Time Window an additional hour. A reservation is now required for all trucks entering GCT Bayonne between 0600 and 1000.

Drivers are advised that no trucks will be allowed to enter the terminal without a reservation during this time period, and those without an appointment are asked to avoid queuing in the area before 9:45am.

GCT-Bayonne also announced that they will open the gates this Sunday 4/30 from 0600 until 1300. No reefers, whether empty or loaded, or OOG will be handled, and appointments are required between 0600 and 1000.


